Pattaya here

Proposed ferry service to start in October or sooner if sea trials successful

■ HUA HIN. THAILAND

When local expats first heard of a plan to launch a regular ferry service between Pattaya and Hua Hin, most laughed it off as just another pipe dream to go with the 'Disneyland in Hua Hin' and 'Bangkok to Hua Hin oversea superhighway' stories.

Now it seems as though that disbelief was misplaced, as the Swedish owners of Thailiving Ferry have announced that the catamaran vessel they will be using is now undergoing sea trials; if these are passed then they will be able to eventually operate a twice daily service across the Gulf.

The website of the company is not completely ready as yet, but has got will start in October 2009; however service will start later this month.

The craft, named 'Imagine' will be licenced to carry up to 100 passengers, and the trip is expected to take 3 hours. No official information is available vet as to price or the departure and arrival an announcement that the service points but we will bring this to you as soon as it is known. It was Pattaya Today reports that the reported in the Pattaya press last month that the price was likely to

be 1200 baht each way however.

The owners have spent two years already to get to this point and it must be hoped that they will have learned from other failed attempts to run such a service; certainly the main concern for many would be the sea conditions at certain times of year and the implications for comfort and safety. 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SWINE FLU SLOWLY CATCHING UP WITH DIARRHOEA AND HICCUPS

■ BANGKOK, THAILAND

THE number of cases of swine flu could catch up with the number of cases of hiccups and diarrhoea, given 10-12 years, doctors have claimed.

As the department of health turned the panic knob back up to seven, GPs said there was a danger that runny tummies and spasmodic diaphragms could eventually be outnumbered if the air force carpet-bombed all of Thailand's major towns and cities with water balloons filled with swine flu round-the-clock, for a fortnight.

A spokesman for the Thai Medical Association said: "There are currently about three million cases of hiccups, some of them very nasty indeed.

"Meanwhile there are about four million cases of diarrhoea, all of them very nasty indeed.

"There is even a handful of people who have diarrhoea and hiccups, and that's one of the worst combinations you can get. Probably even worse than toothache and plague. It's certainly messier.

"But where is their leaflet? Where is their TV advert? Where is their desperate, pathetic front page of the Daily News?"

The TMA is proposing three large digital counters at Victory Monument in the centre of Bangkok to display a running total of Thailand's swine flu, diarrhoea and hiccup victims.

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The spokesman added: "If at any point the swine flu total overtakes one of the other two you will either s**t yourself or be so frightened it will cure your hiccups.

"As for all the swine flu, there's a good chance that I have contracted it and then recovered from it at some point between the beginning and the end of this sentence."

In other swine flu news, from the UK, Sky News reported that England and Manchester City footballer Micah Richards has caught on to the trend. Says Micah from Cyprus:

"At first I thought it was a really bad chest infection, or maybe alcohol poisoning. I felt so weak I couldn't move or eat."

"When I was told I had swine flu all sorts of things started going through my mind. You see on the news people dying of it."

Meanwhile, a medical chief has said there was no need for alarm after a hospital patient became the first British person without underlying health problems to die after contracting swine flu.

That's right, one person in the UK who was not already acutely ill has died from swine flu. Just one.

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
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
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■ LIVERPOOL. ENGLAND

Visitors can also get the latest updates on what medication is available in Hua Hin, as there is no shortage of pharmacies but what they stock and what's available over the counter is another matter. The media frenzy over the escalation of H1N1 cases in Thailand also has people talking. Have you ever wondered where a certain phrase comes from, or what it really means? Every week we will expand your knowledge of English and its etymology with a different word or saying. This week it is...

The rub of the green

Luck; especially in sports and pastimes played on a green surface.

Snooker and golf commentators in the UK often refer to the 'rub of the green'. From the context of their remarks it is clear that what they mean by the phrase is 'luck', usually bad luck. It could be assumed that the green in question was the green baize cloth that covers the snooker table or a golf putting green. However, despite both sports having ancient origins, the term rub was first used in the game of bowls. A 'rub' is any hindrance or impediment that diverts the bowl from its proper course. The term is virtually synonymous with 'let', which also remains with us in lawn tennis and in the expression 'let or hindrance'.

Some of the early 16th century references to rubs are figurative, and so we can assume that the literal term rub was in use before then. Shakespeare alludes to a rub in Richard II, 1593:

Lady: Madame, wee'le play at Bowles.

Queen: Twill make me thinke the World is full of Rubs, And that my fortune runnes against the Byas.

Of course, Shakespeare also referred to 'the rub', with the meaning of 'the obstacle', in one of his best-known passages - Hamlet's 'To be, or not to be' speech:

To sleep: perchance to dream: ay, there's the rub;

For in that sleep of death what dreams may come

The first appearance of 'rub of the green' in print found doesn't have anything to do with sport, but from Philip Horneck's The High-German Doctor, 1716, which is a strange rambling discourse on the occult. Horneck uses the expression as the name of a character. The first citation found of the current, sporting meaning of the term does come from the world of golf - in Golf, A Royal & Ancient Game, edited by R. Clark, 1875: "Whatever happens to a ball by accident... must be reckoned a rub of the green."

Over time, a 'rub' has altered in meaning from a physical hump, dip or some other hindrance on the green's surface to 'a stroke of good or bad fortune'.

■ LIVORNO, ITALY

Bride's bouquet causes plane to crash


The age-old tradition of a bride throwing a bouquet at her wedding reception caused a light aircraft to crash in the Italian port city of Livorno.

A newly-married bride and groom had hired a small plane to fly past their female guests and throw the flowers to them at Montioni park in Suvereto.

A passenger on the aircraft, named as Isidoro Pensieri, 44, had the job of throwing the bouquet as pilot Luciano Nannelli flew past. According to reports, it is believed the bunch of flowers became entangled as it was thrown and was sucked into one of the engines, causing it to catch fire and explode.

The plane went into a nosedive and plunged into a hostel. Fortunately, the plane's pilot and the hostel's 50 guests escaped unscathed.

Bouquet-thrower Ms Pensieri was not so lucky. Italian media reports she suffered multiple fractures and a head injury and was taken to hospital by helicopter.

ARSENAL FANS HOLD PRAYER VIGIL FOR ADEBAYOR MOVE

ARSENAL fans staged a candlelight vigil at the Emirates stadium last night praying that Manchester City's bid for Emmanuel Adebayor is successful. Candles were lit in front of a hastily erected shrine depicting the striker heading up the M6, while others released white doves clutching ceremonial transfer cheques. Adebayor fell out of favour with Arsenal fans after sitting in a deckchair and reading a book on the halfway line during a Champion's League match.

Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger said: "City are keen to sign Ade, as well as the tea lady and a really nasty painting of Ray Parlour in the board room. I offered them a brace of cheap Ivory Coastians and as many Frenchmen as they could fit in their van. The next thing I heard was the 'beep-beep' of a forklift backing up with all the money." City will pay by the hundred-weight for the players, with Wenger offloading whatever leftovers are hanging around the changing room, and Tomas Rosicky. He added: "I've completely forgotten what we originally bought him for. Does he clean the bogs?"

City are expected to field a 1-1-8 formation with Adebayor playing in the inside-wide-right-secondary-holding striker position until someone explains to Mark Hughes what midfield is.

Wayne Hayes, secretary of the Arsenal Supporters' Club, said: "Arsene brought us success, beautiful football and the glorious Thierry Henry. But if the Adebayor deal falls through, I swear I'll rip his bollocks out through his nose.'



Ribery shocks the football world AWOLEXCLUSIVE

In demand Frenchman quits the game

■ MUNICH, GERMANY

The world of football, and in particular Real Madrid, Liverpool, Chelsea and Manchester United, were stunned last night by the announcement that Franck Ribery was quitting the game completely. Initial reports suggested that this was due to a persistent, recurring injury, but AWOL understands from a source close to the player that this is not the case.

AWOL can exclusively reveal that the real reason the French international winger is quitting is because he has received an 'undisclosed but substantial' offer to become the new Phantom of the Opera. Our source said, 'Once this offer came in it was clear to everyone that his head had been turned; after all offers like this don't come along very often.'

Ithas now been revealed that Ribery had a long standing ambition to live under the Paris Opera House and to randomly capture female members of the chorus and turn them into divas; his family have admitted that this fascination with the French novel by Gaston Leroux started a few years after the horrific car crash which left his face scarred for life.

Negotiations have been complex due to the fact that Ribery can't sing to save his life, and a deal has been

brokered where Michael Crawford will do any singing necessary.

Ribery is said to be 'thrilled' although apparently a 'very enticing' offer to be the new Hunchback of Notre Dame is still on the table, and sources close to this bid feel that they can snatch Ribery away with an increased offer, and the lure of Salma Hayek as his Esmerelda. One advantage of this bid is that Ribery will not need to have his hairstyle altered to take the role.

Reaction to the news has been mixed, with Sir Alex Ferguson reportedly saying "He is extraordinarily thin and his kit hangs on a skeleton

frame. His eyes are so deep that you can hardly see the fixed pupils. You just see two big black holes, as in a dead man's skull. His skin, which is stretched across his bones like a drumhead, is not white, but a nasty vellow. He could a ha' the pick of Ronaldo's cast off girlfriends". John Terry was meanwhile less complimentary, saying "E's a frog ain't he? Likes musicals and books. I knew 'e was gay". Legendary lunatic Frenchman Eric Cantona said "As ze tractor pulls ze plough, so ze little channels are made. We are all just little seeds in zese little channels". There is really nothing we can add to that.

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
